Summary. In August 2017 the EU-EYE has appointed Dime Limited, Oxford, UK as its external advisor and revised its strategy and activities to strengthen its organisational capacity for its advocacy work. The EU EYE was accepted as Partner to the B3 Action Group on Integrated Care of the EIP AHA and was registered with the HPP of the European Commission. For the first time the organisation has entered formally into the consultation and decision making process of the European Commission by submitting into two public consultations and attending the public hearing events of the EXPH.

EU EYE Activities 2017

New opportunities and entry targets were identified in the political process and the organisation increased its efforts to improve the internal awareness of its members regarding policy developments in the areas of health, research, training and education across Europe.

1 General Organisation

- EU EYE appointed Dime Limited as its external advisor. Dime Limited is a firm specialising in strategy and policy in health, research, ethics and security across Europe;
- Agenda Communications continues to organise the activities of EU-EYE including the management of its website <u>www.eueye.org</u>;
- the website was redesigned with a new theme and the EU EYE narrative was strengthened;
- a knowledge mapping exercise was launched aiming to identify expertise and recruit members for forthcoming activities; this activity is ongoing;
- a set of performance indicators were developed to monitor the cost-effectiveness of the advocacy activities;
- a tailored e-newsletter is distributed online to members monthly since October 2017.

2 Advocacy

A partner of the EIP AHA

The EU-EYE has integrated into its policy work an on-going commitment to peoplecentred eye health care at European level. The commitment, entitled "Creating a forum to maximise the integration of research priorities, policies and strategies in eye health" includes the delivery of ten awareness activities on the importance of an EU framework to support sustainable eye care as a minimum. It was formally submitted to the B3 Action Group on Integrated Care¹ of the European Innovation Partnership on Active Healthy Ageing (EIP AHA) in December 2017. The EU EYE has now been conferred the

"EIP on AHA recognition mark"² awarded to EIP AHA partners for the contributions to active and healthy ageing efforts.

Health Policy Platform

The EU EYE is now a registered use of the Health Policy Platform³ (HPP) of the European Commission.

In November Professor Carlo Traverso, Vice-President of the EUEYE, attended the annual meeting of the HPP.

In December the EU EYE has lent its support to three out of the four Thematic Networks selected by the European Commission in the third cycle of the scheme for 2018 within the HPP framework. The EUEYE endorsed the joint statements of the Thematic Networks of the HPP⁴ on:

- "the employment of people with chronic diseases" led by the European Chronic Disease Alliance:
- "the harmonisation of medical training" led by the European Society of Radiology and
- "the antimicrobial resistance" led by the European Public Health Alliance.

Public consultations, hearings and events

For the first time the organisation has entered formally into the consultation and decision making process of the European Commission by submitting into the public consultations of the European Commission on:

- Evaluation of the EU blood and tissues and cells legislation in August
- -Transformation of Health and Care in the Digital Single market in October.

The EU EYE is now following closely the work of the Expert Panel for the investment in Health (EXPH) with Professor Massimo Nicolò, a member of EURETINA, attending the EXPH hearing on "Benchmarking access to healthcare in the EU" in October.
